nbc's coverage of the Traditional Authorities' Affairs & Interest Groups with emphasis on disputes

The Namibian Broadcasting Corporation (nbc) has noted with concern the mushrooming of disputes among some Traditional Authorities.

The corporation would like to once again emphasize its mandate as outlined in the NBC Act, 9 of 1991.

In terms of this act, the nbc's role is to inform, educate, entertain and promote peace and nation building.

Recently the nbc has been inundated with requests to air messages from various traditional groups and individuals that do not comply with the corporation's mandate and editorial guidelines.

The corporation therefore would like to appeal and remind the public that the Namibian Broadcasting Corporation would not allow its platforms to be used to incite violence, conflicts or cause division amongst communities.

nbc Director-General, Stanley Similo says while the nbc subscribes to the notion of freedom of expression and association, the corporation will not be used to sow division and promote conflict.

Similo says that the concerned groups must resolve their conflicts and not bring their battles to the nbc airwaves as the corporation would not like to become the third party in such disputes.

ABOUT Digital Terrestrial TV (www.nbc.na)

Digital television is a new way of broadcasting television. Although digital terrestrial television changes the way pictures are sent to your TV, it won't change the way you watch television.

Since the beginning of television, we've been watching what is known as 'analogue television': TV signals are broadcast using radio waves, which are picked up by an aerial and sent down a wire to your TV, the analogue television receiver. Your set then changes the analogue signal into pictures and sound. nbc boasts altogether with Eight (8) channels on its DTT bouquet – nbc1, nbc2, nbc3, One Africa, TBN and EduTV (nbc4), Music on 5 (nbc5) and Kwese Free Sport on 6 (nbc6).
